SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

General information

First aider: Pay attention to self-protection!

If unconscious place in recovery position and seek medical advice.

When in doubt or if symptoms are observed, get medical advice.

After inhalation

Provide fresh air. Put victim at rest, cover with a blanket and keep warm. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Get medical advice/attention.

After contact with skin

Wash with plenty of soap and water. Take off contaminated clothing and wash it before reuse. In case of skin reactions, consult a physician.

After contact with eyes

Protect uninjured eye. Rinse cautiously with water for several minutes. Remove contact lenses, if present and

After ingestion

Observe risk of aspiration if vomiting occurs. Do NOT induce vomiting. Rinse mouth immediately and drink plenty of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person or a person with cramps. Get medical advice/attention if you feel unwell.

4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Causes serious eye irritation. Causes mild skin irritation.

First Aid, decontamination, treatment of symptoms.
